From our thriving community groups on campus to the impactful missions initiatives that reach far beyond Riverbend's walls, God's faithfulness was on full display in 2023.

Riverbend's missions team continues to meet the needs of our Austin and greater Austin community, serving both locally and abroad. Between Austin Blessings Co-op, Harvest Blessings, Woven Blessings, Baby Blessings, and Blessings Delivered, we served nearly 4,500 families per month and approximately 200,000 neighbors in 2023. What an incredible way to be the hands and feet of Jesus.

Over the last year, our family and student ministry has grown nearly 100%. With a focus on celebrating the uniqueness of each family, our programs and groups work to create opportunities for parents and kids to grow equally in their faith and their family bond. To strengthen our Riverbend community and individual relationships, we continued Wednesday Nights at Riverbend: a time for our church to share a meal, do a deeper dive into the Sunday message series, and connect with others. We included a rotation of our Pastoral team facilitating these table discussions.

In the spring of 2023, we welcomed over 4,000 to our Easter weekend events. Back to the Bend launched us into the fall season with 1,500 in attendance, while thousands of people enjoyed our family-focused October Riverfest, and approximately 6,500 guests

packed our Christmas Eve services in the Home for Hope. Riverbend Centre for the Arts hosted more than 36,000 Austinites to concerts, theatrical productions, graduations, and corporate gatherings. We saw many new faces at these events.

Operationally, we completed the installation of one of the largest solar panel configurations in the United States on the roof of the Home for Hope. This project spearheaded our ReNew Riverbend initiative as we strive to be good stewards of our campus and provided energy savings that we can pour back into our community. This was significant decision that set Riverbend apart in our city. We also launched a new giving

> platform, in partnership with Pushpay, to provide opportunity for more people to contribute efficiently to good work at Riverbend. Our communications team is nearing the launch of new, updated website too.

I pray that as you read through this report, you feel God's fingerprints upon this place, upon our community, and upon the work we do. As we prayerfully look ahead to a new year, I'm encouraged and inspired at

all we've done and all we have yet to do. There is still so much impact Riverbend has yet to make. Thank you for being an important part of our community and our family of faith.





With these themes in place, Riverbend's Men's Ministry has consistently dedicated intentional meeting time and growing resources towards equipping the next generation from the experiences and collective wisdom of the generations before them - and vice versa.

Through respectful, loving, and honest relationship we continue expanding our depth and reach from a rock-solid foundation of God-seeking men who learn to depend on one another and thrive in a community. How do we do this? We seek intentional time together.

Men's Ministry Pastors Kevin Hedges, Paul Viebrock, and the Men's Leadership team cherish opportunities to not only come alongside men in times of challenge, conflict, and need, but also seek out conversation and life-sharing with a proactive equipping approach that asks: "Why wait for it all to hit the fan?" Guided by the Spirit, we endeavor to help men discover or renew their committed focus to Jesus; experience God's faithfulness and loving grace; and find - and provide - meaningful, fulfilling relationships, challenging spiritual growth outcomes, and involvement in extensive service opportunities.

2023 saw the emergence of several new groups with an emphasis on examining God's Word as applied to life challenges, current events, and cultural confusion and distracted division. These weekly groups combine the ease of a drop-in

atmosphere with sustained relationship-building and faith-strengthening - with several options to meet various stages and paces of life.

2023 also saw the continuation in the growth of our men - young(er) and old(er) in:

Our 3rd annual Riverbend campus-hosted "Men's Hangout" - a purposeful, intentional time of rest, relaxation and just... hanging out.



- Men's Monthly Meetups with off-site activities like RR Express Baseball, Texas Stars Hockey, eye-popping events for the most ardent car enthusiast, and various and sundry 'officially sanctioned and adapted' meeting places / formats (i.e. 'pub inspections') and just... hanging out.
- An ever-increasing awareness of the needs of whole family and couple's relationships as we deepen our synergy with Women's and Family Ministries. This is crucial work.



- Emotionally Healthy Spirituality® by Peter Scazzero - an 8-week course designed to "... unpack core biblical principles to guide you into an experience of lasting beneath-the-surface transformation in your relationship with Christ."
- Living Free® by Mike Riches Learn about "God's original design for you..." and how to "...break the spiritual strongholds and generational sin patterns from your life."

A growing list of service opportunities also manifested in 2023 with particular focus towards our Austin Blessings Co-Op, specifically work in Piedras Negras. Delayed in 2023, Prison Ministry and human-trafficking will see further focus as Riverbend Men continue providing a strong presence serving those in need with all Riverbend Missions opportunities.

There has possibly never been a better time to prepare and equip men for the myriad of challenges – spiritual, physical, emotional, communal, and familial — in our world today. Spiritual formation, an intentional study and practice of our faith journey, will be expanding (even more!) for Men's Ministry in 2024.

- The Deeper Journey Riverbend's original spiritual formation and practice curriculum, will be offered on an invitational basis in a revised 18-month format for the purposes of developing core practitioners and instructors – designed for replication.
- The Trailhead Another of Riverbend's original programs, this 10-week course approaches some of the core, foundational principles, and practices for a deepening life of faith.





This year, Women's Ministry embraced the theme "Thrive!" to remind and encourage women that Christ wants what is truly best for us. In a world that is too often divisive and coldhearted, we've stayed focused on providing many opportunities for women to come, relax, be fully themselves, and be warmly welcomed into this loving faith community just as they are.

We've offered an assortment of options so that women can find the space(s) that fit them best. Most casual are our Community Groups, which are a space for women to gather and share about how we live out our faith in our day-to-day lives. More structured Bible Study offerings and Deeper Journey classes encourage ladies to dive into the Word and soak in God's wisdom to help guide each step they take. And we've been deeply grateful for our weekly Prayer Circles, whose participants pray fervently for their sisters and brothers - both here at Riverbend and far beyond.

Women's Ministry Pastor Diane Haney and her team of Audrey Parker, Rachel Collins, and Kacy Hill have delighted in finding ways to foster connection, open-hearted sharing, and ever-growing faith in Christ for the women of Riverbend. Bolstered by an impressive team of lay leaders who diligently help plan and facilitate women's groups, meetups, and events, we aim to reach women right where they are, regardless of how long they've attended or their life circumstances.

In April, we hosted a new event called "A Time to Thrive" for 147 women on a beautiful Saturday morning. All the content and breakout sessions

In May, we piloted a new "Flowers on Mother's Day" fundraiser that raised over \$2,700 for Women's Ministry from 227 flower bouquets getting purchased and distributed. Impressively, 77 bouquets (over one-third) were purchased as donations so that Women's Ministry could distribute them to widows, single moms, and women with heavy hearts. Since it was such a powerful illustration of a church family showing love and support to each other, we plan to repeat this fundraiser next year.



And in October, we saw tremendous success hosting a new fall event to both women and men called "The Centered Soul" to 153 attendees. With Pastor Stephanie Rollins featured as the key speaker and eight breakout sessions led by experts in their fields, we received strong positive feedback across the board. We plan to offer this event in future years.

We look to the coming year with gratitude and enthusiasm as we prepare for the 2024 Women's Weekend Getaway in San Antonio at the end of January. We are beyond blessed by the loving and steadfast commitment of so many Riverbend women to their faith in Christ and to each other.

Notably, our nursery ministry — an integral facet of our congregational experience — consistently operates at near capacity on Sunday mornings. We continue to celebrate infant and child dedications and have welcomed over twenty new families into this meaningful tradition this year.

The stewardship of our preschool ministry now rests in the capable hands of Jack Knapp, one of our trusted childcare workers with years of childcare experience (and a former Riverbend employee, now back!). Jack holds a degree in education from Concordia University and is a phenomenal asset to our ministry.

Over the past year our elementary programs have witnessed unprecedented growth, underscored by the inception of our preteen camp, an immersive week-long overnight camp which drew the participation of a dozen of children. Additionally, we orchestrated perennial favorites such as the Daddy Daughter Dance and introduced the inaugural Mother-Son event, which we hope will become a recurring event for our community.



In Student Ministry, our commitment to fostering connections and spiritual growth persists.

Our much-anticipated student summer camp

Our commitment to serving and walking alongside our families remains steadfast, with plans for continued diverse offerings and opportunities in the future.

A resounding appreciation is due to our dedicated family ministry team—Reyn Harpole, Sage Olszewski, Rhett Shields, Susan Kennedy, Traysi Space, Jenny Keener, Jack Knapp, and Barbara Deckers. Their unwavering dedication forms the bedrock upon which our impactful ministries are built year after year.

A special acknowledgment is extended to our invaluable volunteers who contribute their time and talents every Sunday, whether cradling infants, leading small groups, facilitating checkins, assisting with one-off events, engaging with teenagers, or serving on our kids' security team. Their selfless service is deeply appreciated, and we are grateful for their commitment to the families of Riverbend.

As we look ahead, our rision remains steadfast as we seek to expand the number of families calling Riverbend home and equip parents with the encouragement and resources needed to, as the proverb states, "Point your kids in the right direction."

Our Boomers are invited to serve Riverbend in nearly every area of ministry. Choir, Community First, Neighborhood Development Centers, Woven Blessings, Riverfest, Kid's Ministry are just some of the ministries that benefit from sacrificial support and volunteering from this demographic.



One of the most profound newer ministries that flourished in the last year at Riverbend is the Lighthouse. Launched by Sharon Butler (and her husband Daron) this FREE ministry provides a place (morning/afternoon) for people with memory care needs to enjoy community together while their caregivers find respite during that time. This amazing ministry is becoming noticed in our community.

Our Senior adults are an active group. They meet in different bible study classes each week. Classes are taught by Pastors Dean Busboom and Mark Johnson, Mike Fuhrman, retired Pastor Paulette Schwartz and many other women leaders.

Dean's Tuesday group meets 49 times during the year, and just completed their third year studying the book of Psalms. They should finish the study around the first of May 2024.

Dean conducted 10 infant baptisms, 4 weddings and many funerals, memorial services, and Interments. He also made visits to hospital, nursing homes and individual homes.

The seniors attended A Christmas Carol at Zach Scott in December.













The Care Ministry at Riverbend exists to support the emotional and spiritual well-being of our church members, while nurturing a community where people feel seen, heard, and loved.

2023 was a time of transition as Martha Sloan came on board as Pastoral Care Director. Building on the rich 33-year legacy of Paulette Schwartz, Care ministry looked to carry on this wonderful foundation while also re-energizing some programs affected by pandemic limitations.

The Pastoral Care Ministry joyously celebrated many weddings while we also faithfully supported families celebrating the lives of their lost loved one in our beautiful Chapel.

We continue to place strong reliance and insistence in supportive personal and community prayer with three weekly prayer teams that faithfully pray over the requests from the congregation.

And, in May, August, and November we gathered in the Upper Room for 24 continuous hours of prayer to seek God's goodness for a multitude of community concerns including families, educators, first-responders, veterans, Riverbend and Austinarea churches, and much more.

Throughout the year Pastoral Care ministry assisted in the one-on-one and personal needs of this burgeoning faith community. Care also either hosted or assisted in several events and programs including: The Candlelight Remembrance service; communions; Ash Wednesday: Good Friday

Again, continuing a multi-decade commitment, five 12-step support groups continue to meet every day of the week in the Quads. We see them thriving as their attendance numbers steadily increase post-Covid.

stations of the Cross experience.

As we move into 2024, Care will bring together a refreshed lay led Care Ministry team to provide individual care support for church members and beyond, in addition to a new Grief Recovery class to be offered several times throughout the year.

2024 promises to bring continued opportunities to strengthen our community through pastorally responding to the needs of our church family.





In the Spring of 2020, as COVID-19 began to ravage our communities, it became clear that a single church, while well-intentioned, could not satisfy the increasing demands for all the practical, emotional, and spiritual needs of our community. Riverbend Church, together with several faith-based partners, non-profits, businesses, and others, began to organize and collaborate around the resources each organization could bring to bear on the significant challenges facing our communities.

In 2023, we witnessed an explosion in the demand for our services. Working through a set of affiliated, like-minded ministries, we have focused our efforts on poverty alleviation, both at a practical and a spiritual level: people experiencing homelessness, working poor, immigrants, homebound, elderly, children, foster teens, etc.

Our Harvest Blessings Food Pantries fed nearly 150,000 people from all walks of life over 1.8 million pounds of healthy groceries. Our Woven Blessings Clothing Ministries provided over 20,000 clean, high-quality clothing items and shoes to vulnerable families. And our Baby Blessings Ministries distributed over 225,000 diapers, car seats, and other supplies to 883 young families across the Central Texas region.

We launched a mobile-intensive ministry, Blessings Delivered, that focuses on delivering fresh groceries and clean clothes throughout the great Austin area to homebound patrons who are unable to travel, as well as the formerly homeless living at The Other One's Foundation. Over 1,000 meals were served through this impactful ministry.

Through two major initiatives, our Angels Afoot Ministry provided 1,200 children in Austin and Mexico with backpacks and school supplies, and our Christmas initiative distributed over 3,000 gifts to 8 partner organizations, including Christmas Toy Stores in Austin and Mexico.

We embraced and supported the efforts of several high impact, targeted missionally oriented ministries like Hopefully Sow (foster teens), Threads of Love (children), Community First Village (homelessness), Fishers of Men (indigent men), Austin Disaster Relief Network (crisis), and Mobile Loaves & Fishes (homelessness).

While poverty relief is a clear goal of the work we do, we never forget that spiritual support is

a key component of our services. Everything we do to fulfill practical needs is balanced with initiatives aimed at building relationships with Jesus Christ. Displaying the love of Jesus is at the core of everything we do, as is spiritual formation. We pray with thousands of patrons every month, we welcome them into the arms of our front-line church partners, we offer a variety of spiritual services at various times throughout the year, and we serve hope at every opportunity.

And this focus is not solely limited to our patrons. We have over 2,000 volunteers in our registry, and we filled almost 4,000 volunteer spots in 2023 across all our affiliated ministries. Many of our faithful volunteers are initially drawn into Austin Blessings Co-op because of the variety of volunteer opportunities and flexibility of our serving schedules, but they quickly discover the impact of these ministries on their own faith journeys. Our humble, kind volunteers are the foundation of our organization, and we are inspired by their commitment to service and to spiritual growth.

And our commitment to serve "outside the walls of our church" doesn't end in the Austin area. Internationally, we have a presence in Mexico and El Salvador. In Piedras Negras MX, we partner with several organizations that support immigrants, women, and the working poor in that community. In 2023, we spearheaded three separate mission's trips: Children's Day, Smart-Start Education/Backpacks, Christmas Toy Store. Collectively, we engaged with hundreds of children, their parents, and a significant number of immigrants making their way to the U.S/Mexico border.

In El Salvador, our longstanding commitment has produced much fruit. Working with our local partners, we share the love of Christ and foster education with impoverished Salvadoran communities through a variety of initiatives. It is the mutual belief of the local Salvadoran leadership and Riverbend Church that these two areas are critical for the future. Together, we are involved in many outreach ministries, we offer prayer and encouragement, and we offer sponsorships of K-9 students, high school students, and university students affiliated with Bautista Internacional Siloe Church.

Whether locally or globally, we are looking forward to furthering our commitment to serving vulnerable people and neighborhoods in 2024. We will continue to mobilize compassionate people and organizations, focusing on practical, emotional, and spiritual needs. And in doing so, our hope is that our neighbors near and far will truly experience the love of Christ.







In October of 2022, we entered a new season of Riverbend's Sunday service experiences as we came together as a church — merging our Celebration and Resonate gatherings into a single, unified service. This change marks a significant shift in Riverbend's approach to Sunday mornings, requiring the Riverbend's Creative Arts Team to collaborate and craft services in new ways.

The worship planning team — including Carlton Dillard, Travis Taylor, Maddie Schulte, Jake Painter, and Ty Taylor — boldly stepped into this new challenge. While we know this change hasn't been easy on every Riverbender, we've seen God do some significant things at Riverbend through these changes in the last year.

With a deep commitment to increasing congregational participation during worship, our team began 2023 by reducing the number of worship songs we sing at Riverbend. We also created nearly a dozen original arrangements and mashups of modern worship songs with timeless hymns. Additionally, we began incorporating bi-lingual worship in a few of our Sunday services — and we're excited to pursue more bi-lingual worship experiences in 2024.

By September of 2023, we saw a need to further develop our culture of worship at Riverbend and we launched an open worship time on Wednesday nights. Wednesday nights create an opportunity for our worship team, volunteers, and congregation to gather and experience worship in an intimate setting each week.

In November of 2023, we prayerfully presented a

worship and communion experience that has been affectionately nicknamed "The Family Room," where we invited our church family to join us on stage during worship. Through big and small changes like these, we've experienced our church family engage in worship with a new sense of vigor and vitality.

With the desire for deeper levels of congregational involvement, our Creative Arts Team made some daring decisions in 2023 to re-examine some longstanding Riverbend traditions. For the first time in decades, our Good Friday Experience was moved out of the chapel and into the Home for Hope (Auditorium) — from seven services across two days to a single service on Friday evening. This change allowed us to dramatically change the presentation of the service through lighting, media, and sound without compromising the total number of attendees.





more than 16 original songs written and performed during our Sunday services. Additionally, we placed a high priority on sharing testimonies from within our family. Between our Easter sermon series, summer kickoff sermon series, and several Sundays in between, our video team created and curated over 11 moving testimony videos.

The past year of ministry has challenged and inspired the Creative Arts Team in ways we can only describe as "ordained." It's clear that God is on the move at Riverbend — continually calling us to reach the broken, battered, bruised, and bored in new and old ways by pushing us into the future, inviting us to engage with each other and others, and prompting us to see His goodness and provision around every turn. As we look toward 2024, we anticipate that God will continue to lead us into wilder, deeper waters as the Riverbend community.

Additionally, with the changing cadence of the biannual Christmas Sing-Along, the team decided to offer a different type of Christmas concert experience to the city of Austin. Cohosted with the Riverbend Centre, the team produced the Austin premiere of Andrew Peterson's Behold the Lamb of God. The evening, attended by 800 guests, featured several of Austin's finest musicians sharing the story of Christmas through song. While these changes may or may not become mainstays of Riverbend's annual creative offerings, we're excited to see how the creative team will challenge us in 2024.

In addition to focusing on congregational participation, the Creative Arts Team sought to increase our capacity to find and share stories from within our congregation. We piloted a Riverbend songwriting team composed of musicians, both new and old — many from our former Celebration and Resonate worship teams. In 2023, the songwriting team produced more original music than any previous year, with


